April to July 2024

September 2024

#### **Community Input**


Residents are being engaged through open houses and surveys, while stakeholders are participating in workshops.

Parks, recreation and culture facilities, programs and services are used by residents of all ages and backgrounds.


- Clarington will grow by 40%, reaching 162,640 residents by 2036.




